

Primary Sports Premium Funding

The Department for Education has allocated all primary schools a Sports Premium grant to help them achieve the following vision:

ALL pupils leaving primary school will be **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

Schools must spend this grant to fulfil the government objective:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (*above*) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

If the objective is achieved, it is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following five key indicators:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles;
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement;
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
5. increased participation in competitive sport.

Fairford Primary Sports Premium Spending

PE and sport at Fairford Primary is flourishing; the vision outlined by the Government is always at the heart of planning and development of PE and sport.

We have used the grant to spend in the following areas, helping us to meet the Government objective:

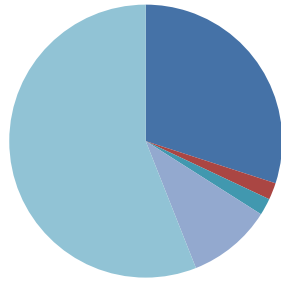
1. **Purchase of equipment:** more specialised equipment has allowed us to deliver a broader range of activities with greater depth. This engages more children and facilitates the development of a wider range of physical skills in all children at Fairford Primary.
2. **Specialised expertise supporting subject development and increasing participation in competitive sport:**
 - a. The profile of PE and sport within Fairford Primary has improved so that it is now an integral part of the school which children and parents are proud of. Our reputation within the local area is strong; it is expected that Fairford Primary are represented at competitions organised by CSSN with a range of teams that always compete with passion and a strong sense of sportsmanship.

- b. There is an intra-House sports competition structure set up so that all children take part in level 1 sports competitions at the end of each term.
 - c. Sports assembly features as a calendar event every term to celebrate and raise awareness of our school's involvement in sport.
 - d. Development of Sports Day so that it is seen as the pinnacle of the Sports Calendar.
 - e. Local 'Cluster Fun!' events are organised by Fairford Primary in specialised sports. We invite local primary schools to take part in these so that our children have more opportunities to take part in level 2 competition against children from other primary schools.
3. **Admin support:** taking children to competitions out of school creates a high volume of paperwork.
 4. **CPD:** ensuring that professional skills are developed.
 5. **Transport:** hire of coaches and minibuses to attend events and competitions so that the children of working parents are able to participate.
 6. **Facilities:** hire of local Sports Centre, Gymnasium and Astro so that teams are able to practise a given sport in a specialised venue.
 7. **Specialised sports coaches:** to deliver a broader range of after school clubs for children to attend.
 8. **Taster days:** specialist bought in for the day to deliver a taster session in an activity that is not offered through PE.
 9. **Entry into competitions.**
 10. **Membership and subscriptions to sporting governing bodies.**

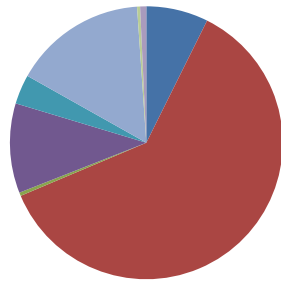

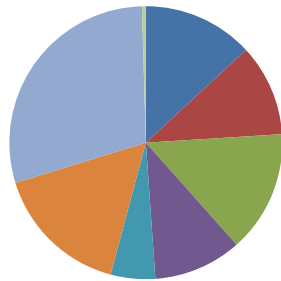
